Open an internet web browser as you would normally do using, for example, Microsoft Internet Explorer, Firefox or Google Chrome. In the URL BAR - (that's the bar at the very top of the screen where you type the address of the website you want to access), type in National Federation of Women's Institutes (or just NFWI will work too) and then press enter. The first entry that comes up should be National Federation of Women's Institutes. Click on this and you will be taken to the web page. Look for 'Find a WI' in the top right hand corner of the page. Click on this and you will see a box on the left hand side of the screen where you can 'search for local groups in your area'. Enter your postcode or 'Ingoldisthorpe' and click 'Search'. Ingoldisthorpe Village will be listed just below. Click on the 'Find out more' box. On the left hand side of the screen you will see a list of the various pages you can visit. Here you will find up to date information about our WI, including who your committee members are, meeting dates, future events and event reports.
