Outing To Lincoln - A group of our WI members accompanied by friends and members of neighbouring villages on a trip to Lincoln on 14th March. The primary reason being to see the enormous 'Table of the Nation' on display in the magnificent and famous Cathedral. The table is made from one 'Bog Oak' tree retrieved from Wissington Fen so is of particular interest to those of us living locally. Most of us are aware of the Sugar Factory there with the lorries delivering the beet from local farms throughout the winter months but had no idea such a wonderful item could be made from a 5000-year-old tree buried in the fen. There was an excellent information board accompanying the table explaining how it had been removed, dried out, losing some 40% of the water within the wood before craftsmen prepared, cut and planed and polished it to the beautiful almost black finish it now has. The timeline of life in England during

the time the tree lay captured in the fen buried is quite remarkable. The table, which will seat 25 people each side, will be on display until April when it will be dismantled and transported to another locality to no doubt be admired again. A photograph really does not do the exhibit justice but here is one anyway. *Addie*
