Autumn Federation Meetings – Have they had their day?

For the past two years we have had to cancel the Autumn Federation Meetings because of the low take up. So we're asking ourselves *and more importantly, you* – are members still interested in them? Have they run their course?

The idea of the Meetings was to bring WIs together, showcase what the Federation Committees were doing and listen to a speaker (or speakers).

They're hard work for everyone involved and we could easily say "well, after two years we will call it a day and save ourselves some heartache" – but that wouldn't be right, if members like the meetings.

We've wracked our brains to consider how we could revamp them, bearing in mind that we need to keep costs down both for us and members attending.

How often have you gone to your monthly meeting, not really looking forward to the speaker and then found that you enjoyed them?

So the question is: do you think we should continue to hold Autumn Federation Meetings? Please ask the question at your June meetings, take a survey by show of hands and let us have the feedback. We're sure that many members will say "it depends on the speaker" – but as I've pointed out, we can't please everyone and you may be surprised! Have you any ideas for a facelift?

Please let us know what you think by 1st July. If we don't hear from your WI, we will assume that they are no longer of interest – but on the other hand, if we have an overwhelming response to carry on, we will. The only thing is – you have to support it!
