## GREAT BIG GREEN WEEK 18 - 26 SEPTEMBER 2021



This is a national week of events celebrating action on climate change and communities across the country wil join together for the Great Big Green Week. It will be the biggest event for climate and nature ever in the UK, and everyone's invited!

As a member of the Climate Coalition, the WI has been campaigning for action to reduce climate change since 2009. In November 2021 the UK will be hosting a crucial climate conference, COP 26. This UN Conference will be attended by 196 countries and is a vital chance for us to get strong international action on climate change.

As for Attleborough WI, and after discussing it with the Committee, I got in touch with Attleborough Town Council to see if we could participate in any events the Council might be laying on during The Great Big Green Week. I had several suggestions for them, including a stall with information for Attleborough residents on what the WI as a national organisation was doing to combat Climate Change, as well as asking if we could either sponsor, or buy, plant up and maintain a container with seasonal flowers in Queen's Square. I have not yet heard back from them, so it looks unlikely that anything will be arranged by the Town Council for The Great Big Green Week. But, individually, we can still do our bit........

#### WHY NOW?

We are seeing the impacts of extreme weather events caused by climate change on the people and places we love both here in the UK and abroad. The time is now to do everything we can to protect them. Climate change is the fight of our lifetime.

This year, we in the UK have a huge opportunity to raise the ambition of plans to tackle climate change at home and abroad. The UK is hosting a major UN climate summit, known as COP26, in Glasgow this November. This means Parliament and local authorities alike want to be seen as ambitious in tackling climate change.

The Time is Now for a Great Big Green Week that sets the stage for the most ambitious climate summit ever.

#### What can we do?

We have to cut our emissions to zero in 29 years; that's the same as halving them every ten years or cutting them by 7% year on year. It means, every year:

- Buying 7% less petrol for your car, sharing rides or taking the bus or train;
- Buying 7% less beef, lamb, milk or cheese or going veggy for a couple of weeks;
- Flying 7% less each year taking holidays nearer home.
- You're already careful with the heating, but you could already start cutting the gas bill by 7% each year by not heating empty rooms, and improving the insulation each time you decorate the room.
- Next time you replace the car or the boiler, make sure the new one's electric and small, and if you're having any new work done tell the builders not to use any cement or new steel, and use second hand materials where possible.
