



Using library applications on computer/laptop (mobile apps on phones)

If you have a Norfolk library card you have access to many online resources



Spydus a free app which lets you access Norfolk library services and manage your membership, any time. Use the app to borrow books in the library by logging in and scanning the barcode on the date label. You can also use it to search the library catalogue, download eBooks and eAudio books, keep track of your library account, and manage the items you have got out on loan. Use Spydus Mobile to scan barcodes on books, CDs, DVDs, or other items while you are out and about, and then search for available copies at your local library.

Online subscriptions – some are accessible in your local library only; some are available from any device when you log in with your library card. The Norfolk Library Service has paid for them, so you do not have to e.g. RB Digital for emagazines, 19th century British Library newspapers, Encyclopaedia Britannica online. Access these apps via the Library website or download for Android on Google Play or App Store for Apple and log in with your library card number/email address/ passcode.



RBDigital have moved the library eAudiobooks from their app to Overdrive's Libby app (from 3/11/2020) which is a Library platform for online lending. You need to use OverDrive or the Libby app to borrow eAudiobooks.

But many magazines, such as Gardeners World, Woman and Home, Simply Knitting, Countryfile plus many more can still be read free via RBDigital.



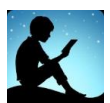
Libby is a reading app for borrowing digital books and audiobooks from the Norfolk library's OverDrive collection. This free app is available for Android, iOS (iPhone/iPad/iPod touch), and Windows 10 devices. Libby is highly recommended for those new to borrowing eBooks and eAudiobooks. Libby is the app released by OverDrive. It has the same collection of titles as the OverDrive app - it is just a different way to access the same digital library collection.



OverDrive app is compatible with devices, including Kindle Fire, Macs, PCs, and Windows mobile devices.



Borrowbox Borrow eBooks and eAudiobooks free with a Suffolk library card. You can apply for a library card if you: live in Suffolk, Norfolk, Cambridgeshire or Essex, work in or visit Suffolk, but do not live there. Your Suffolk library card allows you to: borrow titles, renew, reserve, and view your details and loans online, download ebooks, eAudiobooks, online newspapers and magazines and music for free. <https://www.suffolklibraries.co.uk/>



Kindle the Kindle app gives access to 1.5 million books, magazines, newspapers, and you do not need to own an Amazon Kindle to use it. Amazon charges may apply.

There are many other apps to get free stories like '**Let's Read**' and '**Bedtime Stories**' for children, or '**Audible**' for audiobooks and podcasts. The library service also has **Learn my Way**, not an app but an online free course on using a computer, browsing the web, sending email, and finding work online.
