



#### Have your say on the Government's 10-Year Cancer Plan

The Department of Health and Social Care is developing a 10-Year Cancer Plan to improve England's cancer services, and they are asking for evidence and ideas to help shape their plan.

As part of our See the Signs campaign, we are teaming up with Ovarian Cancer Action to create a single submission on behalf of the ovarian cancer community.

Help us tell the Government what's important to you by **<u>completing this short</u> <u>survey.</u>** 

The survey covers topics including:

- The sources you go to for information on the signs and symptoms of ovarian cancer
- Any ideas you have for how to raise greater awareness of the signs
- How confident you would feel recognising the signs and going to your GP if you experienced any
- What you would like to see prioritised over the next decade in ovarian cancer
- And about your personal experiences, if you have or have had ovarian cancer

The survey is open to everyone in the UK, the Isle of Man, Jersey, and **Guernsey**. You do not have to live in England to respond or have personal experiences of ovarian cancer.

We will use the responses we receive to inform our joint submission with Ovarian Cancer Action and future campaigning activity to increase awareness of the signs of ovarian cancer and help to ensure that more women receive an earlier diagnosis. This is a key chance to raise awareness of the need for everyone to know the signs of ovarian cancer and to improve diagnosis. It is vital that as many members as possible share their views and experiences so that we can make a strong case to the government. Please share the link to the survey as widely as you can.

The survey will close on **27<sup>th</sup> March 2022**.

Please note that the timeline for the consultation on the 10-Year Cancer Plan was set by the government. We would ordinarily give members much longer to take part in surveys like this, but the government's timetable means that on this occasion we have a very limited window to gather feedback from members and submit our response. We appreciate your understanding regarding the timing of this activity.
