Fabric Christmas Trees

These small trees are constructed using eight Suffolk Puffs, a cotton reel, and a small stick or piece of dowling. They are easy and take no time to make.

A Suffolk Puff is a circle of fabric with small running stitches around the outside which is then gathered up and the thread finished off. There's not enough room here for the full instructions and templates so if anyone would like to make one of these, I will be happy to let you have a copy.
