  Community Garden Grant awards:

- Project Pit Stop: Helen Greaves, the Strategic Lead for the Norfolk Ponds Project (www.norfolkponds.org) at Pond Restoration Research, University College London has been in touch. They are undertaking a pilot project on pond mapping and conservation specifically on the Norfolk Coast over the winter months (December/January). She says: I will be looking to engage 50 local volunteers in this project and we will aim to produce a citizen science app at the end of it, and undertake a pond management weekend in February. - The Tunnel of Light in Norwich: is back, with over 57,000 LED lights! There will also be amazing projections onto Norwich Castle. It started on 17th November and runs until 5th January.
