Walks - An outing to Titchwell RSPB Nature Reserve

To celebrate the Great Big Green Week, Norfolk Federation organised a trip to Titchwell RSPB Nature Reserve. Audrey, Jean and Di joined a group of 22 other members from WI's across Norfolk.

We split into three groups. Our guide, Ray, had over 40 years' experience and he pointed out many birds, plants and trees during our tour. The reserve is full of wading birds, wildfowl and geese at this time of year so do take binoculars if you visit. We saw too many to mention them all, but we did particularly enjoy seeing a Great White Egret, a Marsh Harrier and fluffy Avocet chicks.

To say it was a good tour would be a serious understatement and if you haven't visited the RSPB reserve then do add it to your bucket list. *Di*
