
We are now gearing up for our attendance at the National Annual Meeting in June, but before that there is the first Gliding Day at the end of the month!

Things to do & Other Useful Information

• Information Alert from Norfolk
Trading Standards – 'Copycat'
websites: "We are reminding Norfolk
residents to continue to be aware of
'copycat' websites when looking to access
official sites to apply or make payments for
services online.

Copycat websites are those which offer services from Government Departments or Local Government but are not the official site and charge an additional fee over the genuine cost, even where the official application fee is free, for their 'assistance'. Many of these companies are legitimate and it's not against the law for a company to offer a service similar to an official body. People often get confused because the copycat sites can be unclear whether they're an official service or not. Work is ongoing with this sector to ensure that people are not misled, and some sites have been shut down. When you are looking to apply for this type of service online always remember:

- All official sites can be reached by searching on www.gov.uk. Use this link rather than using an online search engine.
- Make sure you know who you are dealing with, take time to read the information on the website to ensure that you're using the official service
- If you do use a search engine don't just pick the first result on the page If you think you have used a copycat site and feel you were misled you can get further advice from our partners the Citizens Advice consumer helpline by calling freephone o808 223 1133
- Guided walk for WI members at RSPB Titchwell Marsh or Snettisham **Reserve:** The RSPB have emailed to say that they are offering "an opportunity for local women to get together and enjoy a stroll through the beautiful landscapes of Titchwell Marsh reserve. We can run a walk on any week day at a time to suit, although mornings are generally better to enjoy a wide spectrum of wildlife. If you would prefer a female guide, then this would have to be on a Monday or Tuesday. We can also arrange an early evening walk on request. The charge is £6 per person plus reserve entry fee (free to RSPB members), if you want an evening walk then we will waiver the entry fee."
