

### Members' meeting: Wednesday 25th June at 1.30pm

Another action-packed meeting for members this month. Just about a full house again, with just Janet B, Mary N, Margaret A, Jo, Debbie and June P unable to join us.

We welcomed visitors "Aunty" Pam who came along with JJ, Pat and Sheila Young.

To start off the business side of things, Hilda thanked Barbara for arranging a really enjoyable outing to Priscilla Bacon Hospice gardens, followed by lunch, on 13<sup>th</sup> June. And members were also able to thank Betty for organising our outing to Bury St Edmunds on 18<sup>th</sup> June, when we had a fabulous morning learning about the cathedral, and then pottering about the city and lovely abbey gardens.

Sheila Young from Old Buckenham WI was our delegate to the National Annual Meeting and she kindly gave us a comprehensive read-out of the virtual meeting which she attended with other delegates from Norfolk Federation at Evelyn Suffield House. Sheila's full read-out is attached separately.

Amongst the correspondence from Fed Office was a request to ask members what we felt about supporting a local charity instead of ACWW. Hilda asked for a show of hands and a large majority of us felt this was a good idea. Fed Office had also asked us whether we thought the Federation Autumn meetings had had their day. Quite a few of us had attended these meetings in the past and had enjoyed them – good speakers, the chance to interact with other WIs, learning about the various Federation committees etc – so when asked to vote on this, 18 of us wanted them to continue, with 6 voting no. Genevieve will pass the results of these ballots on to Federation Office.

Diaries and calendars for 2026 can now be ordered, and Ann asked members to let her have names by the end of June at the latest. Ann also has some raffle tickets for the National WI raffle available. Onto the reports from our Sub Committees, details of of which are overleaf.

Members then enjoyed a delicious tea party, with sandwiches and cakes provided by the Committee. Several members asked "why the "special" tea", to which the answer is: "why not?!".

Then the moment we were all waiting for: the Auction, with Janet Potter as our Auctioneer: she did a great job. We had a total of 14 "lots", all kindly donated to us by members; one of the lots was a year's worth of cakes – ie 12 cakes for each month of the year, baked and delivered by Hilda; this raised an astounding £60 – thank you Chris F. A total of £208 was raised which will go towards our next educational outing. A huge thank you to all who donated items and to those who bidded for them.

The competition was a guess of how much we'll raise from the Auction and the clever winner was Doreen. There were six lucky raffle winners, then we had a read out of birthdays for the month.

Hilda had a couple of AOB items: she reminded us that next year our WI will be 90 years old, and suggested compiling a birthday scrapbook, which would include information and photographs of our activities over the year, what's going on locally etc. Betty has kindly agreed to help with putting it together. Members were asked to let her have any contributions they would like to see included.

Genevieve then asked members whether they might be interested in buying tickets for the national WI lottery. Tickets are £1 per week and 40% of every ticket sold goes towards our WI. The top prize is £25,000. Sheila Young mentioned here that Old Buckenham WI earns about £30 from the lottery as they have about 20 people who have bought tickets. Quite a few of us thought we might be interested, and Genevieve agreed to set up the web page so that members can read more about the lottery and buy tickets.
