

# IMPORTANT - PLEASE READ

## Change to holding of emergency contact details for WI members

Some while ago it was suggested by Federation that we should hold emergency contact details for our members. This was a voluntary thing and not all of our members chose to do this. We have held these details in sealed envelopes ready to be opened in case of emergency for some time now, without them ever needing to be used, and they have never been updated.

It was discussed at the last committee meeting and the decision was taken that we would no longer hold these details and they would be destroyed.

The suggestion was made that members could, as an alternative, keep their emergency details (for example phone number to contact in case of emergency and perhaps any allergies) in their phone using the Emergency button, which would allow anyone to see these details without needing the PIN number to access the phone. Alternatively a simple slip of paper kept in the phone case or purse would equally do the job. This has the advantage of being available not only when being out with the WI but in any emergency situation when you are perhaps out on your own. *Cath Roche*
